District 7610 Rotarians Place 8th in Rotary World in *Per Capita* Giving \$207.26 per capita places District 7610 Rotarians 8th among 531 Districts in the world

Thanks to the generosity of more than 2,000 "whisper goal" of raising \$438,000, or \$200 Rotarians, District 7610 placed 8th in per per capita. Rotary International in 2009-10. Our district goal" last year. was third among all districts in the United States, and we were the first district ever in Zone 33 (DC, DE, MD, VA, WV, NC, SC, TN) to exceed \$200 in per capita giving. Thank you for making this happen!

When all of the numbers were finally totaled, The Rotary Foundation's Annual Programs Fund averaged \$207.26. Giving to Annual Programs Fund exceeded \$453,900, making 2009-10 District 7610's most successful giving year!

Reaching farther and doing better is a District 7610 tradition. Over the past six years, District 7610 Rotarians have, on average, increased their per capita giving by over \$18.00 each year. So, it was not unreasonable to set the 2010-11 annual giving District 7610 Rotarians' per capita giving to goal at \$225.81 per capita and \$499.265.91 in total giving to the Annual Programs Fund. After all, that's only a nickel more per day than we gave last year.

Pakistan Relief Fund Established by The Rotary Foundation

Relief and recovery fund to aid victims of flooding

We are deeply saddened to hear of the recent floods in Pakistan, and we are touched by the commitment of Rotarians to assist the communities affected by this disaster. Rotary International is coordinating relief and recovery efforts, and we are writing to you today to provide you with information on how you may work through Rotary to make a significant contribution toward alleviating this major humanitarian crisis.

Rotary International coordinates information and provides resources on club and district disaster relief efforts. When informed of local relief initiatives, RI shares updates about these efforts on the RI website. Rotarians wishing to contribute funds or donated goods to disaster victims can visit the website or contact RI Staff at relief@rotary.org to learn about current relief and recovery efforts.

Also, The Rotary Foundation has established the *Rotary Pakistan Flooding Recovery Fund* for the purpose of collecting funds in the form of cash and District Designated

Funds (DDF) to be used to assist disaster affected areas of Pakistan. The funds will be collected until 31 December 2010 and will be used as the Foundation's match for Matching Grant applications that are received for disaster recovery efforts. Details about the fund are available on the RI website.

We have been in contact with District Governor Syed Balkhi (District 3271) and District Governor Shehzad Ahmed (District 3272) to offer assistance in publicizing any relief efforts that clubs in Pakistan are implementing. An article will be posted to the home page of the RI website with details on Rotary club involvement in relief efforts and how you can help.

As always, when organizing a response to a local or international disaster, we encourage Rotary clubs and districts to work with experienced emergency relief organizations such as UNICEF, the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, Doctors Without Borders, ShelterBox, Aquabox, and World Water Works to meet the immediate needs of victims affected by the disaster.

It is our hope that with your meaningful and rapid response to this appeal, you will be able to help rebuild the future for millions of innocent people affected by this crisis. Thank you for your commitment to helping disaster victims.

Gain Buy-In to Your Club's Annual Giving Challenge Goals

Shared goals are key to increased giving that gives clubs opportunities for greater service

Setting a S.M.A.R.T. annual giving challenge goal is a key element in increased annual giving that will give clubs It is critical that you obtain your fellow club members' buy-in improved service opportunities through participation District to these challenge goals. How do you do that? and Global Grants in three years, when District 7610 begins its participation under the Future Vision Plan.

A S.M.A.R.T. goal is:

Shared

Measurable and written

Achievable, but challenging

Realistic

Time specific

For example, your club might adopt challenge goals that are similar to the following:

Goal 1: Increase the club's annual giving to \$18,250 and its per capita (per person average) to \$325.00, which represents a ten percent increase above last year's per capita giving.

Goal 2: Recruit four new Paul Harris Society Members who pledge to give \$1,000 or more to The Rotary 7. Foundation's annual fund each year they are financially able.

Goal 3: Become a 100% Paul Harris Fellows Club.

Goal 4: Become a 100% Sustaining Member Club by each member giving \$100 or more to the Annual Programs Fund.

- 1. Obtain board support for the goals.
- 2. Circulate the goals to all members. Include goals flyers on the tables for two weeks in advance of a club assembly. Mail post cards with goals to club members.
- 3. Create excitement about the goals and the plan.
- 4. Build momentum and recruit members of the board and admired members of your club as the first Sustaining Members, Paul Harris Society Members, etc., in advance of a club assembly.
- 5. Appoint table captains to answer questions and lead discussion at the club assembly.
- Hold a club assembly and ask for a show of hands of all Rotarians who support the programs of The Rotary Foundation and want to ensure those programs have the resources to support your club's service projects.
- At the assembly, recognize the PHS, PHF, Major Donors, Benefactors, Bequest Society Members, and Sustaining Members and thank them for their past support. Present any outstanding recognitions (e.g., multiple PHFs).
- Describe how your club has benefited from the programs of TRF. Outline the goals and the plan, and explain why they are achievable. Ask your club to support each of the goals.

Over 180 District 7610 Rotarians Recognized as Triple Crown

District Governor Ron Marion has presented more than 180 Triple Crown lapel pins in recognition of individual Rotarians in District 7610 who are each Benefactors to The Rotary Foundation Permanent

Fund, Paul Harris Fellows, and Sustaining Members.

Remarkably, more than 1,000 Active Rotarians meet two of the three recognition criteria by being Sustaining Members and Paul Harris Fellows. All of these Active Members would qualify for Triple Crown recognition merely by continuing to maintain Sustaining Member contributions of \$100 or more each year, and by becoming a Benefactor and including a donation or \$1,000 or more to The Rotary Foundation's Permanent Fund in their estate plans. It does not require a codicil or a change in your will to become a Benefactor. You only need to complete the Benefactor Commitment Card, submit the card to The Rotary Foundation, and keep a copy of the card with your estate documents. While you can become a Benefactor by making a present gift of \$1,000 or more to the permanent fund, no immediate gift is required. Sign up now!

Which club will be the first Triple Crown Club?

Each clubs whose membership is 100% Sustaining Member, 100% Paul Harris Fellow, and 100% Benefactor will be recognized as a Triple Crown Club, also. Which club will be the first to earn this distinction?

District 7610 Paul Harris Society Reaches Goal of 100 Members!

Society sets 2010-2011 goal of 140 members

In just one year, District 7610 Rotarians increased their

membership in the Paul Harris Society by over one-third, swelling the membership ranks to more than 100, and enabling immediate past Paul Harris Society Chair (and now District Governor) Ron Marion to meet the goal of growing the Society's membership to more than 100. Membership in the Society has continued to grow in 2010-11. Three new members were inducted in July and early August: Randall P. Burdette with the Stafford Rotary Club, James F. They join the more than 110 Rotarians in District 7610 who have pledged to give \$1,000 to the Annual Giving Fund each year they are financially

able. This year, Society Chair Carol Foley has set another ambitious goal: Increasing the Paul Harris Society to 140

Members of the Society help set the pace for giving in District 7610. Last year, Society members accounted for well over one-fourth of all money raised for TRF Annual Programs Fund humanitarian and educational giving.

Virginia Rotarian Ken Frantz has been named one of five finalists in GQ's "Better Men Better World Search" for 2010. With the help of several Rotary clubs, Ken and his organization, Bridges to Prosperity, did just that, and through his full-time volunteer commitment, he has continued to assist people in need in Africa, Asia, and South America, building bridges that change the lives of people and the communities in which they serve.

Plan now to be part of history and give the drops that will change the life of a child—and the world—forever



In February 2010, West Point Rotary Club Past President Colleen Bonadonna and her son traveled to India to participate in a National Immunization Day. In addition to administering polio drops to ensure children will never be infected with polio, Colleen and fellow Rotarians visited an orthopedic hospital and saw how reconstructive surgery allows patients, crippled by polio as children, to walk out of the hospital for the first time in decades.

The Race is On! Districts 7600 and 7610 "Compete" for Paul Harris Cup

District with highest per capita giving to be awarded annual traveling trophy

World sailing has the Americas Cup (shown right), and now Rotary has the Paul Harris Cup!

Starting this year, there will be an annual perpetual trophy competition between District 7610 and our immediate neighbors to the south in District 7600. The winner of the Cup for year 2010-11 and all subsequent years shall be the district with the highest per capita Annual Giving. The sole purpose of the Cup competition is to encourage additional giving to the Rotary Foundation Annual Programs Fund, which provides funding that ensures greater service opportunities to Rotary clubs and Rotarians.

The idea for the cup started as a friendly challenge between the Annual Program Fund Chairs from District 7600, Ken Frantz, and District 7610, Scott Mills. Had the competition started in year 2008-09, the cup would have been won by 7600 with \$173 in per capita giving versus \$150 for 7610. However, last year (2009-10) District 7610 Rotarians gave a record amount, and would have overwhelmingly won the cup back with \$207 in per capita giving versus \$156 for 7600. So, the race is on!

District 7600 claims it has mobilized teams of foundation advocates employing highly confidential and secret strategies to win this year's competition. It is rumored that spies (posing as make-up guests at clubs that lie on the district borders) may be sent to uncover proprietary information. It is unclear if such spies can legally be deployed under the cup rules that state that: "....the Rotary 4 Way Test shall become the guiding principle of the Cup competition....". Seriously, all of this is merely a fun way to increase giving to The Rotary Foundation and increased participation in its humanitarian, vocational, and



educational programs.

In true Rotary spirit, the district that looses the competition must attend the opposing district's fall banquet and personally award the trophy to the winner. This "humble pie" congratulatory presentation must be done by either the loosing District Governor, the Foundation Chair, or Annual Fund Chair.

Increase your club's giving by providing easier opportunities for Rotarians to give to The Rotary Foundation. Idea No. 1: Include a contribution option as a line item on

your club's monthly or quarterly dues, which the club can submit quarterly to The Rotary Foundation via a **Multiple Donor Form. Idea No. 2**: Promote giving via TRF-Direct.

Club Foundation Chairs can circulate option election forms to members now, thereby affording members the opportunity to meet this year's goal of increased Sustaining Member participation and \$225 per capita in annual giving. An election form for your club might read:

Rotary club. Please include on my quarterly club dues invoice a Rotary Foundation donation in the amount of:
 \$25 (to be a Sustaining Member).

Please add an additional donation in the amount indicated to my second quarter dues to ensure that I'm a Sustaining Member this year.

Please return this form to the club's Rotary Foundation club Chair, ______, who will share the information with the club's treasurer.

To ensure that the contributing Rotarians receive tax credit and Paul Harris recognition for their contributions, the club should forward a check, payable to "The Rotary Foundation," at least quarterly, accompanied by a **Multiple Donor Form** that identifies each donor whose contribution is included in the check.
