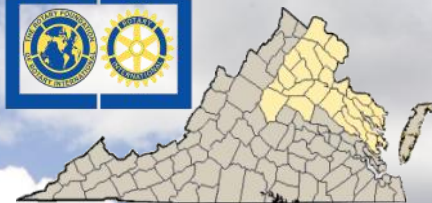

# Group Study Exchange Team Selected

## Four-Week Cultural and Vocational Exchange to Jamaica Awaits Six-Member Team from District 7610

The Rotary Foundation's Group Study Exchange (GSE) program is a unique cultural and vocational exchange opportunity for businesspeople and professionals between the ages of 25 and 40. The program provides travel grants for teams to exchange visits in different countries. For four weeks in May 2010, the team from District 7610 will experience Jamaica's culture and institutions, observe how their vocations are practiced abroad, develop personal and professional relationships, and exchange ideas.

The team members will participate in five full days of vocational visits, 15 to 20 club presentations, 10 to 15 formal visits and social events, two to three days at the District 7020 conference, three to four hours per day of cultural and site tours, and three to four hours per day of free time with host families.

For each team member, the Foundation provides round-trip airline fare between Virginia and Jamaica. Rotarians in Jamaica provide for meals, lodging, and group travel within their district.

This year's Group Study Exchange team members from District 7610 are:



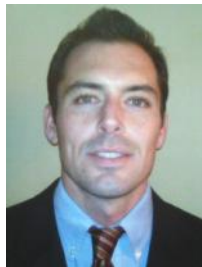

## District 7610 Leads the Way in Per Capita Giving Among 33,000+ Rotarians in Zone 33

In November, The Rotary Foundation issued the first *Every Rotarian Every Year Annual Programs Fund District Progress Report* that included *per capita* totals for the 13 Districts in Zone 33. # Get Donations to TRF by December 31 IRS Deadline!

## Tips to Ensure Your Donations Arrive by the December 31 IRS Calendar Year Deadline

December 31 is the 2009 Tax Year deadline for contributions for U.S. taxpayers who maintain a tax year that ends with the calendar year. Clubs that collect donations via dues have a fiduciary obligation to ensure those donations arrive by December 31. Here are some tips to ensure that donations are attributable during the 2009 Tax Year.

**Checks:** must be postmarked 31 December 2009 or prior and **received** at the lockbox (address below) by Wednesday, 6 January 2010.

**Wire transfers:** must be initiated prior to 31 December 2009 and received by Monday, 04 January 2010.

**Credit Cards:** *Via rotary.org* – must be authorized prior to 31 December 2009, midnight. *Via fax, phone or mail to World*

*Headquarters* - must be authorized prior to the close of business on 31 December 2009.

**To ensure timely recording of credit card contributions requests should not be sent to the lockbox; rather they should be made online or faxed to 847-556-2139.** The Contact Center will be open for credit card contributions on 31 December **only during normal business hours:** 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. CST.

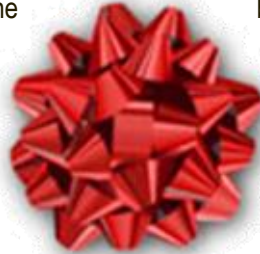

# IRA Transfer Option Available Through EOY

It's Easier Than Ever to Make a Gift of a Lifetime to The Rotary Foundation before December 31

Donations from IRA transfers can qualify for tax-free charitable distributions. If you are 70½ or older, the "Charitable IRA Rollover" provides a unique opportunity to use retirement plan assets from an Individual Retirement Account to make a significant gift to The Rotary Foundation, with **no tax on the IRA withdrawal** (401k's do not qualify).

If you want to take advantage of this opportunity for tax year 2009, the gift must be delivered to The Rotary Foundation **no later than December 31**. Be sure to allow plenty of time—at least two weeks—for your IRA custodian to complete the transaction.



Rollover gifts **do** count toward your mandatory withdrawal, but **do not** count against your maximum personal charitable deduction limitation.

## Becoming a Major Donor Now Easier Than Ever!

Three-year Major Gift Pledge Enables Donors to Easily and Quickly Reach Major Donor Goal

Major Gift pledges, payable over three years, enable donors to achieve Major Donor recognition in the first year, upon receipt of the pledge agreement and first installment of the pledge. Major Donors are recognized with a crystal engraved with doves of peace, and a pin or pendant.

At least one-third of the gift must be donated at the time of the initial pledge. Pledge payments should be in equal installments. For example, a pledge of \$60,000 will be initially funded with a payment of \$20,000 and fulfilled with two consecutive payments of \$20,000 each.

All Major Gift pledges must be \$10,000 or more, and must be documented by a pledge agreement. The donor should complete an official pledge agreement indicating the name of the donor, Rotary District Number, Membership Number, Club Number, amount of the pledge, gift designation (i.e., Permanent Fund-SHARE, Permanent Fund – World Fund, Permanent Fund-Rotary

Centers, Permanent Fund-Children's Fund, Annual Programs Fund-SHARE, or PolioPlus).

Only donations to the Annual Programs Fund qualify the donation towards a club's annual giving goal. Contributions to the Permanent Fund qualify for Benefactor recognition; they do not qualify for Paul Harris Fellow or Bequest Society recognition credit.

All pledge payments must be allocated to the original pledge designation (i.e., Annual Programs Fund, Permanent Fund, etc.).

Upon receipt of each pledge payment, a statement will be forwarded to the donor advising them of their pledge status.
