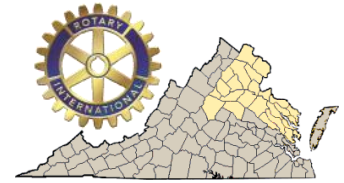

Ambassadorial Scholar Jill Craig Reports from Nairobi, Kenya

Active on the front lines for peace, Jill Craig files her first report as an Ambassadorial Scholar

As an Ambassadorial Scholar to Kenya, I am quite happy to report that I have been a Nairobi resident for almost two full months. I am working on a Master of Arts degree in mass communications from the University of Nairobi. My Rotary hosts of Nairobi-Utumishi have been wonderful, helping me to find a place to live, inviting me to social and Rotary-oriented functions, and answering my myriad questions on a daily basis.

During the almost two months that I have been in Nairobi, I have been quite busy participating in Rotary club events. My host club is active in the community, and as a result, I have been able to assist with many of its projects. During my first full week in Nairobi, I attended a horror movie fundraiser for the club, which was produced by a club Rotarian who also is a filmmaker. I have assisted with other club projects, including the World Diabetes Day Walk and Diabetic Training, Jaipur Foot Project, Masai Mara Marathon (photo, right), VOSH Eye Camp in Kibera (photo, below), and Orphan Christmas Party.



I have given seven presentations to Rotary clubs and one Rotaract club in Nairobi, with plans already to give seven more. The District Conference will be held in Kampala next April, and I will have the opportunity to meet clubs from Uganda, to whom I may make other presentations.

My first impressions of Nairobi was that it was not the stereotypical "Africa" that we imagine in the U.S. Nairobi is a cosmopolitan city—not the Africa you imagine when watching *Out of Africa!*

Almost all the conveniences of home are available here, so sometimes it can be easy to forget you are in Africa. There are nice restaurants, the Internet connectivity is good, cell phones are everywhere, and there are plenty of grocery stores, ATMs, department stores, etc.

People are very friendly. After getting lost my first day of classes, a lady led me to the university office about which I had inquired, and then told me that her daughter was studying in Canada, and she hoped that a stranger would do the same for her.

I took about four weeks of Kiswahili language courses before arriving in Kenya, and still I'm learning from the people here—*pole, pole* (slowly, slowly). In some ways, I am relearning English—the British way. For example, the toilet is a "loo," a flat tire is a "puncture," to want is "to fancy," and thank you is "cheers." Kenya was a British colony, so there is a distinct British feel to the country.

But for all of Nairobi's glitter, there is a sadder side as well. The Kibera slum has been identified as Africa's largest and was featured in the movie *The Constant Gardener*. Kibera, unfortunately, is not the only slum in Nairobi. There are many others, all lacking proper hygiene, sanitation, and educational systems for the children. This is why I was so pleased to participate in the Kibera eye camp. It gives some assistance to people merely eking out a survival here. I hope to work on more projects like this one over the next year.

I am so grateful to have received this scholarship, and I look forward to sharing my experiences with District 7610 clubs when I return next year.

Per Capita Giving for December DOWN \$65,000 from December 2009 Contributions

Books for December close on January 5, 2011, for all contributions postmarked by 12/31 and received by 1/5/11

As of December 27, **per capita giving for December dropped almost 70%**—more than \$65,000—compared to December 2009's contributions of \$95,000 for the same period. **Twenty-nine of 53 clubs have given less—or nothing at all—to Annual Programs Fund this year**, compared to the same period last year. Clubs and Rotarians are encouraged to mail and postmark ALL contributions by midnight, December 31 to ensure arrival by January 5, 2011. All donations that are postmarked by December 31 and arrive by January 5 will be posted to 2010's contributions, and donors will be eligible to take a tax deduction for 2010, to the extent permitted by law. Mail your contribution with a [donor form for an individual](#) or a [multiple donor form](#) for a single check representing several donors from one club.

Please mail your contribution today or call 1-866-9ROTARY to make a telephone credit card contribution before 5PM on December 31. Please call early. Lines will be busy.

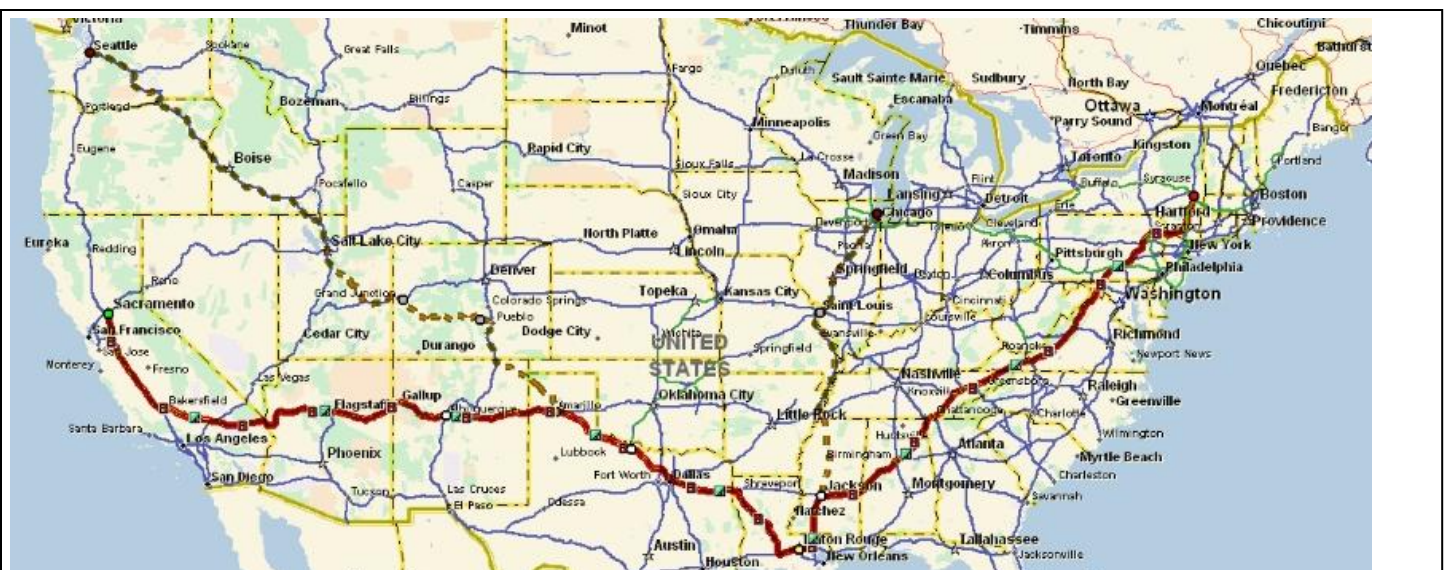

Foundation Quick Tip: IRA Rollover Contributions Avoid Taxes—for a Limited Time Only!

New federal legislation allows for up to \$100,000 in contributions without adding to your income.

New federal legislation became effective December 17 that is of special significance to The Rotary Foundation and Rotarians. The new Act features an extension of the IRA Charitable Rollover, which allows taxpayers starting at age 70 ½ to direct up to \$100,000 per year from their individual retirement accounts (IRAs traditional or Roth - **NOT 401k** plans) to eligible charities without including the distributions as gross income for tax purposes. Even if you personally do not qualify because you are not yet 70 1/2, please share this great news with someone who does.

Since it was so close to the end of the tax year when the bill was signed, the Act allows taxpayers who make IRA gifts by 31 January 2011 to count those gifts towards the 2010 tax year.

Limitations:

- Donors cannot rollover money from their IRA into a gift annuity or charitable remainder trust
- Donors cannot rollover money from their IRA into a donor advised fund

[Instructions and a transfer form](#), which a donor will need to complete the transfer, are available online.

This is a limited-time opportunity to make a significant contribution to The Rotary Foundation without including the funds in your gross income. Transfers that result in a donor's total, cumulative contributions of at least \$10,000 qualify for Level One Major Donor recognition, while contributions of at least \$25,000 qualify for Level Two, and \$50,000 qualify for Level Three. Of course, IRA rollover transfers of any amounts would be greatly appreciated.
