Avoid End-of-Year Delays in Processing and Posting. Send Your Club's Contributions Before June 1.

Annual Programs Fund giving for Rotary Clubs in District 7610 is tracking ahead of the rate of giving during our two best giving years of 2006-2007 and 2007-2008. With a sustained effort through June, we have the opportunity to finish the year as a \$200 per capita district, ranking among the top ten Districts in the Rotary World!

It is essential that all year-end contributions are sent to The Rotary Foundation as soon as possible to be recorded for this Rotary year.

Historically, nearly half of all annual contributions to The Rotary Foundation are received between April and June. With contributions up this year, delays in processing money and recognitions may occur.

Many clubs have a tradition of waiting until mid-June – or later – to send in their contributions for the year. If this is your club's tradition, ***please think of May as the new June and submit your contributions in May this year.*** This will allow the Foundation staff to credit and record your contributions sooner, acknowledge donors in a more timely fashion, meet any year-end recognition event deadlines, and ensure you have the opportunity to submit requests for adjustments or corrections before the end of the



Rotary year. This will be very important for clubs that are trying to earn the EREY and the 100% Sustaining Member Club banners for 2009-10.

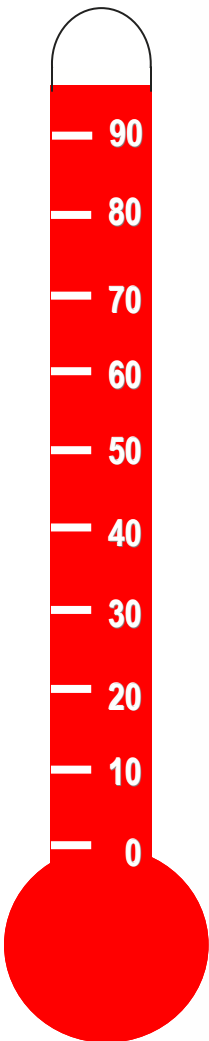

Mills Receives Citation for Meritorious Service

The Rotary Foundation's Board of Trustees Honors Mills with TRF's Second Highest Honor

On April 22, The Board of Trustees of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International voted to honor Rotary District 7610's Annual Giving Chair, Scott Mills, with The Rotary Foundation's second highest honor, the Citation for Meritorious Service. The Citation was presented to Mills on May 1 at Rotary International District 7610's annual District Conference, which was held at Kingsmill Resort in Williamsburg, Virginia.

During Mills' service as Annual Giving Chair, Rotary District 7610 has realized an increase in donations of more than forty percent over the previous year's annual giving. During his term, District 7610 consistently has placed first in per capita giving among all districts in Zone 33, and it currently is first among all districts in Zones 33 and 34, which includes the southeast United States and the Caribbean. At the end of March, District 7610 was third in per capita giving among all districts in the United States and 18th among all districts world-wide.

During his service as Annual Giving Chair, Mills has instituted several innovative programs, including:

- The Charles Ylonen Cup, which recognizes the club with the highest per capita giving over the past three years
- The First Club Challenge, a club recognition program that honors the first club in the district that reaches 100% of its Annual Giving goal and is the first club to become a 100% Sustaining Member club.
- The Triple Crown, an individual recognition for donors who are Benefactors, Sustaining Members, and Paul Harris Fellows, and a club recognition for clubs that are 100% in all three recognition programs.

Mills has been a Rotarian since July 1999. He was named Rotarian of the Year for District 7610 in 2006-07. He served as Club President of the McLean Club in 2007-2008, which was the year the McLean club was named Large Club of the Year in District 7610.

Mills is now a Charter Member of the Rotary Club of Ashburn, which was chartered on February 19, 2010, and for which Mills served as the District Governor's Special Representative responsible for the chartering of the new club.

Rotary International PolioPlus Chair's Message

Robert Scott, chair of Rotary's International Polio Plus Committee, responded to a 23 April [Wall Street Journal](#) article about polio with the following letter:

Dear Editor:

Your April 23 article documents the myriad complexities inherent in the effort to eradicate polio.

Yet, despite challenges both ongoing and emerging, tremendous progress continues to be made. The incidence of polio has plummeted by more than 99 percent since 1988, when Rotary International partnered with the WHO, the CDC and UNICEF to launch the Global Polio Eradication Initiative.

We are especially heartened by the recent progress in Nigeria, arguably the most challenging of the four remaining polio-endemic countries. Increased efforts to reach all of Nigeria's children under age 5 with the oral polio vaccine are paying off, with only two cases recorded so far this year, compared with 193 cases this time last year.

The current outbreak in Tajikistan dramatically underscores the necessity of staying the course until the crippling disease is vanquished permanently. It shows how quickly polio can rebound and reclaim territory, and why "99 percent" is not good enough.

Rotary and its partners have been at this for more than 20 years, achieving successes that demonstrate the feasibility of polio eradication. The partners' commitment and tenacity were recognized in 2007, when the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation stepped in to provide major crucial funding.

Finally, the program has shown that attacking one disease is very far from being a vertical program with the development of trained epidemiologists, the founding of 143 laboratories around the world doing much more than polio work and a surveillance system than can and is used for all communicable diseases.

Washington Nationals Will Help "Strike Out Polio"

Three Dollars of Every Ticket Sold for August 25 Home Game Against Chicago Cubs Benefits PolioPlus

Rotary International and the Washington Nationals are teaming up this season to eradicate polio worldwide. The August 25 game versus the Chicago Cubs has been designated as End Polio Now Night. We can participate in this special evening by purchasing tickets to the game. For each ticket sold, the Washington Nationals are contributing \$3.00 to Rotary's PolioPlus Fund to help complete the important campaign we began over 30 years ago.

There is overwhelming interest in our district to reserve blocks of seats so our clubs can enjoy the game and engage in fellowship with our closest Rotarian friends. However, in order to obtain blocks of seats we must have each club coordinate its ticket sales and then submit a check for bulk orders to District Treasurer John G. John G. will then contact me when we receive blocks of at least 100 tickets at a time so that I can ask the Washington Nationals to set aside seats together. We will begin reserving the Left Field Mezzanine seats (\$25 each) until they are filled and then move down to the Field Level seats.

Nationals. It outlines the process to follow and has Vance's contact information if there are any questions. **This flyer with the Washington Nationals logo cannot be posted on any club web site. Furthermore, your club cannot use the club web site to accept any ticket orders.** We must use our email distribution lists to encourage members to send payments to the club's designated contact. The flyer can be attached to email messages.

Tickets will be sent to Vance and distributed at future district events between now and August 25. Any tickets that are not collected will be kept by Vance until other arrangements can be made. **Orders will be accepted by Vance until July 18.** Our district must pay the Washington Nationals in full for all tickets no later than July 25.

Of course, this is a sporting event so there are no refunds or exchanges once the orders are received. Tickets will not be left at will call for pick up.

We look forward to seeing all of you at Nationals Park on August 25.

TRF Donation Deadlines for FY 2009-2010

The following deadlines apply to gifts to be credited to The Rotary Foundation for the fiscal year ending 30 June 2010:

- **Checks** that are mailed to the lockbox must be **postmarked 30 June 2010 or prior and received at the lockbox by Wednesday, 7 July 2010**. TRF Lockbox Address:

- **Wire transfers:** Must be initiated prior to 30 June 2010 and received in the bank by 3 July 2010.
- **Credit Cards:**
 - **Online via Rotary.org** – must be authorized prior to 30 June 2010 CDT, midnight. (Please keep in mind that gifts received via the web will only benefit the Rotarian who logged in. Reclassification and redistribution requests, a.k.a. corrections, cannot be accepted for these gifts.)
 - **Via fax, phone or mail to World Headquarters** - must be received by in the AR Department and authorized prior to the close of business on 30 June 2010.
 - **Via the Bank of America lockbox** – Must be postmarked 30 June 2010 or prior and received at the lockbox by Wednesday, 7 July 2010. **Credit card contribution requests should not be sent to the lockbox; rather they should be faxed to 847-556-2139 to ensure timely recording, or completed online at Rotary.org.** All credit card contributions coming into the lockbox between 1-7 July 2010 and postmarked July will be held and not processed until after the cutoff of 7 July 2010.
 - Requests to re-process declined credit card transactions for 30 June 2010 (based on the above) should be received in the AR department by 3:00pm on 07 July 2010.
 - Reclassifications/Redistributions: Request must be received in the TRF Corrections e-mail box prior to 3:00 pm on Tuesday, 6 July 2010. A **Reclassification** is a change in the designation of a gift (i.e. changing a polio gift to an Annual Programs gift). A **Redistribution** is a correction of the contributor (i.e. Distributing a Club check to multiple donors)

5,000 Points Still Available for Paul Harris Fellows

TRF Recognition Points Available to Make Paul Harris Fellows of Donors of \$500 or More

Rotary District 7610 is grateful to a very generous Rotarian donor who contributed 20,000 TRF Recognition Points to assist other donors in becoming new or multiple Paul Harris Fellows. Five thousand points are still available to match donations of \$500 or more to the TRF Annual Programs Fund for new, first-time or for multiple Paul Harris Fellows.

The minimum donation for eligibility for the point-match is \$500.00, and only matches in \$100 increments thereafter will apply to donations. Only Rotary District 7610 donors are eligible.
