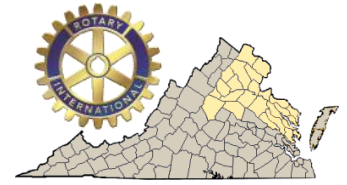

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Annual Giving on Track for Another Record-Breaking Year!

District 7610 is Number One in USA in Per Capita Giving for First Quarter 2010-11

Donations to The Rotary Foundation make possible service opportunities for Rotarians and our clubs. So, it's always cause for celebration when our annual giving efforts expand our ability to serve. Recent reports give us much cause for celebration.

The books recently closed for donations posted during the first quarter of the 2010-11 Rotary Year. District 7610 holds the distinction of having **the highest per capita giving among all Districts in the United States**, and we are fifteenth among all Rotary Districts in the world! Of course, that also makes us number one in per capita giving among all Districts in Zones 33 and 34.

Our District already is 53 percent ahead of last year's record-breaking pace in giving to The Rotary Foundation! In fact, our start for this year has been so good that we are listed among the Top 50 Districts in the world in

Dulles Club Brings Clean Water to Zambia Through TRF Matching Grants

Club's long-standing commitment to water continues to expand quality of life for villages in Zambia

In late April 2010, then President of the Dulles Rotary Club, Scott Didericksen, and an entourage that included Andrew Wade, Jacob Lee Johnson, and Margaret Wade traveled to the Republic of Zambia to make a follow-up due diligence trip for a **Rotary Foundation Matching Grant**. In partnership with the Luanshya Rotary Club located in the copper belt of Zambia, the Dulles Rotary Club has now completed seven boreholes (water wells).

Boreholes are the best, immediate alternative to create a cleaner water solution. Clean water simply creates a healthy environment for whole communities. When a school has a clean water source, they attract healthy students and teachers. A

healthier learning environment will lead to better education for more students.

Villages and schools across Zambia and other African countries currently use shallow wells as their primary water source. Shallow wells carry many health risks. The wells have run off from herbicides, insecticides, animal waste, and human waste. Dysentery and other water borne illnesses are a major problem.

in remote, rural areas in and around Luanshya, Zambia, a small town about 50 miles south of the border of the Republic of Congo. The schools where the wells are installed do not require a reliable energy supply as the wells have a hand pump. Most of the schools have little to no reliable electricity.

In July 2010, The Dulles Rotary Club wrote a new matching grant application for four more boreholes, all within the vicinity of the same school district as the previous seven boreholes. Recently, the club's application was approved by The Rotary Foundation, which will bring to eleven the number of wells dug by the Dulles Club

As of September 2010, The Dulles Rotary Club has developed a long-term plan to supply water in areas where cleaner water does not exist. The Dulles Club is excited to have the following five District 7610 clubs to partner with: Leesburg, Herndon, Baileys Crossroads, Tysons Corner, and Vienna. The Paul Harris Society: A Conversation with Carol Foley, PHS Chair



On July 1, 2010, Carol Foley became the Chair of the District 7610 Paul Harris Society, setting an ambitious but achievable goal of adding 40 new members to the Society during Rotary Year 2010-11. So far, 16 Rotarians and their spouses already have joined the Society this year. This conversation with Carol explores some of the benefits and responsibilities of PHS membership.

Q: Carol, what is the commitment level to become a member of the Paul Harris Society?

A: The Paul Harris Society pledge is for a gift of \$1000 a year. Rotary Foundation

Recognition Points may not be used to fund any portion of the PHS pledge. The full \$1000 must be paid during the Rotary year by June 30, though it need not be done in one check. You may pay in installments (e.g., TRF-DIRECT). Signing up for [TRF-Direct](#) will allow the PHS recognition certificate and pin to be presented at the time of the pledge, rather than waiting until the full \$1,000 is donated.

Q: Do I have to be a Paul Harris Fellow before I become a member of the Paul Harris Society?

A: You don't have to be a Paul Harris Fellow to become a Paul Harris Society member. If you are not already a Paul Harris Fellow, you will become one as soon as you fully fund your first year's PHS pledge or complete a TRF-Direct commitment form equivalent to an annual \$1,000 contribution.

Q: Carol, where do I send my pledge form and initial check (or TRF-Direct form)?

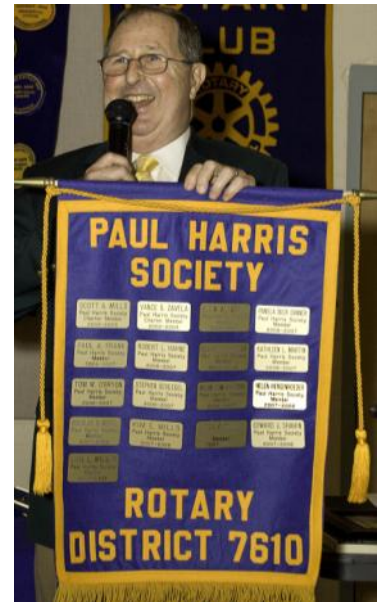
A: Make your check payable to "The Rotary Foundation" and send to me along with the completed PHS pledge form. My name and address are on the pledge form. When your pledge is fully funded, your PHF will be ordered from the Rotary Foundation and your Paul Harris Society recognition will be prepared by the District.

Q: Will my annual PHS donation qualify for multiple Paul Harris Fellows and Major Donor recognition?

A: With each \$1000 gift you will receive multiple PHF recognition with appropriate PHF pin and stones after your first PHF. You may also name a new Paul Harris Fellow using the recognition points from your account. Each donation counts towards recognition as a Major Donor, also, which is recognized when \$10,000 has been donated by an individual or by spouses. All previous personal gifts to the Foundation also are counted toward Major Donor recognition. Your pledge of \$1000 annually will enable you to become a Major Donor very quickly. However, unlike Major Donor recognition, donations by a spouse do not qualify for Paul Harris Society recognition.

Q: Which contributions will best benefit my club and District 7610?

A: Contributions to the Annual Programs Fund will go to fund Foundation programs. In three years the Rotary Foundation will return 50 percent of those contributions to Annual Programs Fund-SHARE to the District as District Designated Funds to be used for the Foundation's humanitarian and educational programs by the Rotary Clubs in our District. The money we raise this year will fund programs in 2013-14 under our first year of participation in the Future Vision Plan when we will be allowed to designate up to 50 percent of our DDF for District Grants, which can be used for community projects.



Q: What if I already made a contribution to the Annual Programs Fund this year? Will it count towards my Paul Harris Society contribution?

A: A personal gift already made to the Annual Programs Fund this year will count toward your Paul Harris Society pledge. For example, if you have already made a \$200 gift this year, you can become a Paul Harris Society member with an additional gift of \$800.

Q: Is the Paul Harris Society recognized by The Rotary Foundation?

A: The Paul Harris Society is an official Rotary Foundation program, but, all administration and recognition is at the District level. A special PHS banner will be presented to each Club when they achieve their first PHS member.

Q: How will my club and I be recognized?

A: The club will receive a banner with gold plates naming each PHS member, after the club has four PHS members. Each PHS member receives a beautifully framed certificate, PHS "wings," and invitations to donor recognition receptions and events throughout the year.

Q: Any closing remarks?

I invite every Rotarian in District 7610 to consider making the commitment to become a member of the Paul Harris Society and bring us closer to reaching our goal of 140 members by June 30?

A Tribute to Past District Governor Robert A. "Bob" Fleming, 1920-2010

We lost a dear friend and fellow Rotarian with the passing of Past District Governor Robert A. "Bob" Fleming on Saturday, October 16, 2010. Our love and prayers are with his wife, Cecile, and her family as we all mourn our deeply felt loss.

Bob was born on June 30, 1920, with twin his brother Michael. He joined the Rotary Club of Annandale in January 1974 and served as its President in 1978-79. Bob was Governor of Rotary District 760 during 1986-1987. District 760 was the predecessor to today's Districts 7600 and 7610.

Bob and Cecile have been committed supporters of The Rotary Foundation; they are multiple Paul Harris Fellows and Major Donors.

On the occasion of his 85th birthday, he was joined by his

brother Michael and other family members at the Annual Awards and Installation Dinner of the Club. The occasion was acknowledged by the outgoing Club President with the presentation of *An Abridged History of RI - Tribute to Bob Fleming on 85th Birthday*.

As a friend and a Rotarian, Bob was warm and welcoming to every visitor and guest at any meeting or other gathering. He was a conscientious and generous mentor to several generations of officers and directors with respect to both the letter and the spirit of all things Rotary. And more importantly, he clearly cared about every single person he met anywhere. Bob Fleming was an excellent role model for any and all of us. We will truly miss his wisdom, kindness and love.

Bob was a U.S. Navy veteran. His funeral service for will be held at Annandale United Methodist Church, 6935 Columbia Pike, Annandale, VA, 22003, on January 18, 2011, at 9:00 AM, with a reception to follow. Burial will be at Arlington National Cemetery on January 18, 2011, at 1:00 PM.

Foundation Quick Tip: Keeping Your Club Informed About its Annual Giving Progress

Chart your club's achievement towards its annual giving goals



The Rotary Club of Annandale has adopted a helpful tool that keeps its members informed about the club's progress towards achieving its Rotary Foundation annual giving goals. The Annandale Club includes in its bulletin two simple, Excel-generated graphs that display (1) the total dollars donated towards the club's annual giving goal and

(2) the percentage of members who have given during the year. If you don't know Excel, perhaps you can include a "hot" thermometer that graphically represents your club's progress towards its goals.

Remember to thank the members who have given and have contributed to the success of your club's annual giving efforts.

The Chronicle of Philanthropy Lists The Rotary Foundation as the 75th Largest Charity In U.S.

"Philanthropy 400" also documents TRF's dedication of 100% of funds to programs

The "Philanthropy 400" is published annually by *The Chronicle of Philanthropy* and lists the top 400 non-profit organizations in the United States. This year, The Rotary Foundation ranked 75th, marking a sharp rise from 167th in just four years, due in large part to the generosity of Rotarians last year, who donated more than \$100 million to

support the programs of The Rotary Foundation. During the same period, other national charities experienced an 11 percent drop in donations.
